**RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

**(Submit letter on behalf of Christian Thompson to dialysis facility)**

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to Article IV, Section 1(a) of the Constitution of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, *inter alia*, the Tribal Council has the authority to represent the Tribe and act in all matters that concern the welfare of the Tribe; and

**WHEREAS**, Elesta Aday, a member of the Tribe, this day report to the Tribal Council of problems her father, Christian Thompson, continues to experience related to receiving his dialysis treatment; and


**WHEREAS**, Ms. Aday requests a letter of support to the dialysis facility to allow dialysis treatment for her father, who returns home on holidays and for ceremonial purposes; and


**WHEREAS**, the Tribal Council concurs with the request for a letter as in the best interest of her father.

**BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that a letter be forwarded to Marilyn Ralston, Facility Manager of the dialysis facility to allow dialysis treatment for Christian Thompson.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Chairman, or in his absence the Vice-Chairwoman, is hereby authorized to transmit a letter on behalf of the Tribal Council requesting dialysis treatment for her father such that he may return home on holidays and for ceremonial purposes.

The foregoing resolution was on July 12, 2006, duly adopted by a vote of TEN for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to the authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (s), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
