



**RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

**(Approving grant application and authorizing budget for the U.S. Dept. of Justice, Community Oriented Policing Services grant)**

- WHEREAS,** pursuant to Article IV, Section 1(a) of the Constitution of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, *inter alia*, the Tribal Council has the authority to represent the Tribe and act in all matters that concern the welfare of the Tribe; and
- WHEREAS,** the U.S. Department of Justice, Community Oriented Policing Services (“DOJ-COPS”) provides cost reimbursement grants to Tribal law enforcement programs; and
- WHEREAS,** the White Mountain Apache Police Department (“WMAPD”) has this day presented a request for submit an application for grant funding from DOJ-COPS in order to provide adequate police patrols and protective services; and
- WHEREAS,** WMAPD intends for the DOJ-COPS grant to fund the replacement of police patrol vehicles; and
- WHEREAS,** after review and consideration, the Tribal Council finds that the DOJ-COPS grant will provide critically needed funding and is in the best interest of furthering public safety and law enforcement services on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation and, in order to provide adequate police patrols and services.

**BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that:

1. The White Mountain Apache Police Department grant application for funding from the U.S. Department of Justice, Community Oriented Policing Service program is hereby authorized for the purposes of funding, through cost reimbursement, the replacement of police patrol vehicles and related support.
2. The grant award for the U.S. Department of Justice, Community Oriented Policing Services Program is hereby accepted, in the event it is approved by the U.S. Justice Department, subject to the terms and conditions of the grant and to a review by the Tribe’s Legal Department.
3. A budget for expenditure of tribal funds is hereby approved for the purpose of cost reimbursement for the DOJ-COPS, if approved by the U.S. Justice Department, and subject to tribal funds as may be appropriated and available.
4. The Chief of the White Mountain Apache Police Department is hereby authorized to manage the U.S. Department of Justice, Community Oriented Policing Services program grant on behalf of the Tribe.

**Resolution No. 06-2007-222**

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Chairman, or in his absence, the Vice Chairwoman, is hereby authorized to execute any and all document necessary to effectuate the intent of this Resolution.


