



**RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

**(Approving Derreck Wheeler's request for financial assistance in the amount of \$1,500
for his attendance at Arizona State University)**

- WHEREAS,** pursuant to Article IV, Section 1(a) of the Constitution of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, *inter alia*, the Tribal Council has the authority to represent the Tribe and act in all matters that concern the welfare of the Tribe; and
- WHEREAS,** Derreck Wheeler is attending Arizona State University Summer Session and has requested financial assistance from the Tribal Council; and
- WHEREAS,** Mr. Wheeler has requested \$1,500 to cover his books, meals, rent and other living expenses; and
- WHEREAS,** an appropriation for said expenditure is required because the Tribal Contributions Account has not been replenished; and
- WHEREAS,** the Tribal Council finds that providing such assistance as described herein to be in the best interest of Mr. Wheeler and the Tribe; and
- WHEREAS,** given the urgency of Mr. Wheeler's request, the Tribal Council further finds that the an emergency expenditure needs to be considered and made outside of its regularly scheduled meeting; and
- WHEREAS,** the Tribal Council further finds that: (1) this Resolution may be voted upon by signature of a member of the Tribal Council where a signature indicates a vote for this Resolution, (2) the Tribal Council Secretary should attempt to obtain signatures for members of the Tribal Council personally, (3) no signature would mean that the respective Tribal Council member is against this Resolution, (4) the Tribal Council Secretary should wait no longer than a reasonable period of time to obtain a vote by signature or by no signature and so indicate that this Resolution was presented to the respective member of the Tribal Council for a vote.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that an appropriation of \$1,500 is hereby authorized, and said amount shall be deposited by the Treasurer into the Tribal Contributions Account and all budgets thereto shall be adjusted accordingly.


BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves Derreck Wheeler's request for financial assistance in the amount of \$1,500 to cover his 2007 student fees at Arizona State University-books, meals, rent and other living expenses.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that given the urgency of the request of Mr. Wheeler, this Resolution may be voted upon as follows: (a) by signature of a member of the Tribal Council, including the Chairman of the Tribal Council and the Vice-Chairwoman of the Tribal Council, where a signature indicates a vote for this Resolution, (b) the Tribal Council Secretary shall attempt to obtain signatures for members of the Tribal Council personally, (c) no signature shall mean that the respective Tribal Council member is against this Resolution, (d) the Tribal Council Secretary should wait no longer than a reasonable period of time to obtain a vote by signature or by no signature, and so indicate that this Resolution was presented to the respective member of the Tribal Council for a vote.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Chairman, or in his absence, the Vice Chairwoman, is hereby authorized to execute any and all document necessary to effectuate the intent of this Resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on JUNE 7, 2007 duly adopted by a vote of SEVEN for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to the authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (b), (h), (k), (s), (t), and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).





To Whom It May Concern:

Greetings! My name is Derreck Wheeler. I am a proud member of the White Mountain Apache Tribe and I am attending college at Arizona State University (ASU) with plans of graduating in May of 2008.

I have demonstrated a great passion for my education and I firmly believed I have earned the educational money that I am in desperate need of. For example, when I attended Alchessay High School I had received the following:

- 7 variety letters in track along with cross-country
- 65 medals in running
- National Honors Society member
- Graduated top 10% of my class with academic honors
- Who is Who Amongst High School Students Award
- Runner of the year in the 3A East Division in 2002
- Team Captain two years
- Part of regional team champions all four years in cross-country and most importantly I remain drugs and alcohol free.

At Central Arizona College I was a member of the National Championship Team in cross-country. Today I am still continuing my education with hopes and dreams of attending law school upon graduation from ASU.

Unfortunately, I am a struggling college student who is a junior in need of financial assistance from my tribe. This past semester I had to borrow \$4,500.00 dollars to pay for my education and I do not receive any money from the Tribal Educational Department until the end of the spring semester. I was informed by the director of the Education Department that the tribe would be of assistance. The director specifically told me to make out a budget for three months. My budget was based upon the three months as stated by the director. I had the following expenses for my personal needs made out:

- ✓ \$600.00 for my apartment
- ✓ \$300.00 for my books
- ✓ \$300.00 for my food
- ✓ \$300.00 for my transport

Grand Total of 1,500.00 dollars.

Sadly, I only received 500.00 dollars and was told that was all I would be receiving. I was cut short 1,000.00 and currently I am without food, over due bills, housing, transportation, and personal necessities because I did not receive the full financial assistance promised to me.

In closing I would deeply appreciate your understanding, sympathy, and your desire to aid tribal members who are working for a brighter future for the tribe by any educational means necessary.
