



**RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

(Waiving Public Works Roll Off Fees for Canyon Day Lighthouse Church)

WHEREAS, pursuant to Article IV, Section 1(a) of the Constitution of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, *inter alia*, the Tribal Council has the authority to represent the Tribe and act in all matters that concern the welfare of the Tribe; and

WHEREAS, the Canyon Day Lighthouse Family Church was attacked by an arsonist on May 19, 2007, who caused considerable damage; and

WHEREAS, the damage has resulted in debris, which has to be hauled off the property by the Tribe's Department of Public Works through the use of roll-off containers; and

WHEREAS, the Tribe's Department of Public Works charges a fee for roll-off container services; and


WHEREAS, the Church has this day requested that the Tribal Council waive roll-off fees for removal of debris resulting from the fire; and

WHEREAS, after considering the request, the Tribal Council finds that a waiver of the fees is appropriate due to the nature of the arson and the importance of the church to the community of Canyon Day.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Department of Public Works is hereby directed to waive any and all applicable roll-off fees due for removal of waste from the Canyon Day Lighthouse Family Church.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Chairman, or in his absence, the Vice Chairwoman, is hereby authorized to execute any and all documents necessary to effectuate the intent of this Resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on August 2, 2007, duly adopted by a vote of EIGHT for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to the authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (b), (g), (h), (i), (s), (t), and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
