



**RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

(Authorizing annual leave payment of 80 hours for Alutha Skidmore and Amending Resolution No. 06-2007-256 for such purpose)

- WHEREAS,** pursuant to Article IV, Section 1(a) of the Constitution of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, *inter alia*, the Tribal Council has the authority to represent the Tribe and act in all matters that concern the welfare of the Tribe; and
- WHEREAS,** a request was made this day for payment of 80 annual leave hours to Alutha Skidmore; and
- WHEREAS,** for the purposes described herein, it was requested that Resolution No. 06-2007-256 be amended in order to allow the payment required; and
- WHEREAS,** given the urgency of Mrs. Skidmore's request, the Tribal Council funds that payment of 80 hours of annual leave needs to be considered and made outside of its regularly scheduled meeting; and
- WHEREAS,** the Tribal Council further finds that: (1) this Resolution may be voted upon by signature of a member of the Tribal Council where a signature indicates a vote for this Resolution, (2) the Tribal Council Secretary should attempt to obtain signatures for members of the Tribal Council personally, (3) no signature would mean that the respective Tribal Council member is against this Resolution, (4) the Tribal Council Secretary should wait no longer than a reasonable period of time to obtain a vote by signature or by no signature and so indicate that this Resolution was presented to the respective member of the Tribal Council for a vote.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that:


1. The payment of 80 annual leave hours is hereby authorized.
2. Resolution No. 06-2007-256 is hereby amended for the limited purposes described herein.
3. The Chief Financial Officer is hereby directed to approve payment of 80 annual leave hours to Alutha Skidmore.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that given the urgency of the request described herein, this Resolution may be voted upon as follows: by signature of a member of the Tribal Council, including the Chairman and Vice Chairwoman of the Tribal Council, where a signature indicates a vote for this Resolution, (2) the Tribal Council Secretary should attempt to obtain signatures for members of the Tribal Council personally, (3) no signature would mean that the respective Tribal Council member is against this Resolution, (4) the Tribal Council Secretary should wait no longer than a reasonable period of time to obtain a vote by signature or by no signature and so indicate that this Resolution was presented to the respective member of the Tribal Council for a vote.


