

RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

(Authorizing a Request for P.L. 93-638 Contract for Law Enforcement)

WHEREAS, pursuant to Article IV, Section 1(a) and 1(s)of the Constitution of the White Mountain Apache

Tribe, inter alia, the Tribal Council has the authority to represent the Tribe and act in all

matters that concern the welfare of the Tribe; and

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe has managed the U.S. Department of Interior law

enforcement program through a contract with the Secretary pursuant to the Indian Self-Determination and Education Assistance Act (P.L. 93-638, 25 U.S.C. §450, et seq.), known as

Contract No. CTH52T60720; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council finds that a proposal to the U.S. Department of Interior, through the Bureau

of Indian Affairs, to contract the federal functions of law enforcement pursuant to P.L. 93-638

to be in the best interest of public safety and the Tribe; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council further finds that the proposal should be in the form of an Annual Funding

Agreement and Model Section 106 Contract, and should include provisions for a three-year

duration and increased funding by the BIA over and above its current commitment.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that:

- 1. The Secretary of the U.S. Department of Interior, by and through the Bureau of Indian Affairs, is hereby requested to contract the federal functions of law enforcement, pursuant to the Indian Self-Determination and Education Assistance Act (P.L. 93-638, U.S.C. §450, et. seq.).
- Said contract proposal should be in the form of an Annual Funding Agreement and Model Section 106
 Contract, which should also include provisions for a three-year duration and increased funding by the BIA
 over and above its current commitment.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Chairman, or in his absence, the Vice Chairwoman, is hereby authorized to execute any and all documents necessary to effectuate the intent of this Resolution.
