



**RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

(Authorizing \$2,000 to be paid to Cheyanne Burnette for her graduation and school expenses)

WHEREAS, pursuant to Article IV, Section 1(a) of the Constitution of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, *inter alia*, the Tribal Council has the authority to represent the Tribe and act in all matters that concern the welfare of the Tribe; and

WHEREAS, Cheyanne Burnette is graduating from Northern Arizona University on May 8, 2009 with a Bachelor of Arts in Liberal Studies with a Public Administration emphasis and has approached the Council to request \$2,000 for her graduation and school expenses; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council supports and encourages its Tribal Members to graduate from college and holds its graduates in high regard; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council finds that it is in the best interest of the Tribe to authorize \$2,000 to be paid to Cheyanne Burnette for her graduation and school expenses.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby authorizes \$2,000 to be paid to Cheyanne Burnette for her graduation and school expenses.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that in the event of any inconsistency between this Resolution and any other Resolution or Policy, this Resolution shall govern.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Chairman, or in his absence, the Vice Chairwoman, is hereby authorized to execute any and all documents necessary to effectuate the intent of this Resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on April 23, 2009, duly adopted by a vote of FOUR for, ZERO against and TWO abstentions by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to the authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
