

## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

(Approval for Tribal Council Members to donate to the 2010 Tribal Fair & Rodeo)

WHEREAS, pursuant to Article IV, Section 1(a) and (s) of the Constitution of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, *inter alia*, the Tribal Council has the authority to represent the Tribe and act in all matters that concern the welfare of the Tribe; and

WHEREAS, the Fair and Rodeo Manager and Commissioners are organizing and preparing for the 2010 Fair and Rodeo festivities without a budget; and

WHEREAS, it has been recommended that each Tribal Council Member donate \$500.00 to the 2010 Fair & Rodeo festivities to help alleviate any incurred expenses; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council believes that the \$500.00 donation from each Tribal Council Member is in the best interest of the Tribe and the 2010 WMAT Tribal Fair & Rodeo.

**BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that each Tribal Council Member shall donate \$500.00 to the 2010 Fair & Rodeo festivities.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that in the event that this Resolution conflicts with a prior Resolution or Policy, this Resolution shall govern.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Chairman, or in his absence, the Vice Chairman, is hereby authorized to execute any and all documents necessary to effectuate the intent of this Resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>JUNE 9</u>, <u>2010</u> duly adopted by a vote of <u>EIGHT</u> for and <u>TWO</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to the authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (s), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
