

RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

(Approving Renewal of an Intergovernmental Agreement for the Public Health Emergency Preparedness and Response Program)

- WHEREAS, pursuant to Article IV, Section 1(a) and 1(s) of the Constitution of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, *inter alia*, the Tribal Council has the authority to represent the Tribe and act in all matters that concern the welfare of the Tribe; and
- WHEREAS, the State of Arizona Department of Health Services (ADHS), through the Bureau of Emergency Preparedness and Response, has been working with the White Mountain Apache Tribe to attempt to ensure the preparedness of each community in the event of any public health emergency; and
- WHEREAS, most of these endeavors have been funded by grants from the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services; and
- WHEREAS, the grant awarded from the state to the White Mountain Apache Tribe is a fixed cost grant; and
- WHEREAS, this Contract is intended to continue and improve upon this process and will be in effect from September 1, 2010 through August 31, 2015; and
- **WHEREAS,** the White Mountain Apache Tribe Public Health Emergency Preparedness Program shall adhere to the following critical benchmarks:
 - 1. Hire or designate a full of part time Public Health Preparedness Coordinator; and
 - 2. Develop an annual Tribal Public Health Emergency Preparedness and Response Plan based on funds and deliverables for each Budget Term; and
 - 3. Document evidence of participation in the development of and inclusion in, regional health emergency preparedness plans maintained by County, State and Indian Health Services, if applicable; and
 - 4. Provide a three hundred sixty-five (365) days a year public health emergency contact number for the Tribal health Department or a designated health emergency contact person.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Intergovernmental Agreement for the Emergency Preparedness and Response Program is hereby approved and shall become effective September 1, 2010.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the White Mountain Apache Tribe Public Health Preparedness Program shall adhere to the following critical benchmarks:

- 1. Hire or designate a full of part time Public Health Preparedness Coordinator; and
- 2. Develop an annual Tribal Public Health Emergency Preparedness and Response Plan based on funds and deliverables for each Budget Term; and
- 3. Document evidence of participation in the development of and inclusion in, regional health emergency preparedness plans maintained by County, State and Indian Health Services, if applicable; and
- 4. Provide a three hundred sixty-five (365) days a year public health emergency contact number for the Tribal health Department or a designated health emergency contact person.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that in the event that this Resolution conflicts with a prior Resolution or Policy, this Resolution shall govern.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Chairman, or in his absence, the Vice Chairman, is hereby authorized to execute any and all documents necessary to effectuate the intent of this Resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>JUNE 9, 2010</u> duly adopted by a vote of <u>NINE</u> for and <u>ZERO</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to the authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (b), (t), and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
