



**RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

(Authorizing Publication of a Manuscript by Johns Hopkins)

- WHEREAS,** pursuant to Article IV, Section 1(a) and 1(s) of the Constitution of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, *inter alia*, the Tribal Council has the authority to represent the Tribe and act in all matters that concern the welfare of the Tribe; and
- WHEREAS,** the Tribal Council supports the efforts and assistance that Johns Hopkins has given to the White Mountain Apache Tribe to evaluate health problems which exist in the community and to develop appropriate interventions which seek to decrease or alleviate these problems; and
- WHEREAS,** Johns Hopkins is requesting permission to publish a manuscript entitled: "*Non-Suicidal Self-Injury in an American Indian Reservation Community: Results from the White Mountain Apache Surveillance System, 2007-2008.*" authored by Johns Hopkins personnel; and
- WHEREAS,** no personal identifiers are indicated or referenced in the manuscript, and all information contained in the manuscript is submitted for the purpose a greater understanding of NSSI among Apaches and to generate important local resources for developing and evaluating prevention and intervention efforts for youth NSSI and suicide among the White Mountain Apache Tribe; and
- WHEREAS,** the manuscript, if approved, will be submitted for publication in the **Journal of American Academy of Child and Adolescent Psychology**; and
- WHEREAS,** the Tribal Council finds that the publication of the manuscript would be in the best interests of the Tribe and the prevention of NSSI behavior among members of the Tribe.


BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves the publication of the manuscript entitled: "*Non-Suicidal Self-Injury in an American Indian Reservation Community: Results from the White Mountain Apache Surveillance System, 2007-2008.*" in the Journal of American Academy of Child and Adolescent Psychology.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that in the event that this Resolution conflicts with a prior Resolution or Policy, this Resolution shall govern.


