Resolution No. 06-2013-141

(Approving W.O.R.D. 2013 Tribal Member Outdoor Recreation Regulations)

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe (“Tribe”) is entrusted by the Tribe’s Constitution to act in all matters that concern the welfare of the Tribe, to manage all economic affairs and enterprises of the Tribe, and to regulate subordinate organizations for economic and other purposes; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Wildlife and Outdoor Recreation Division (W.O.R.D.) has come before the Tribal Council this day to request approval of the Tribal Member Outdoor Recreation Regulations (“Regulations”) for 2013, attachments include 2012 Outdoor Recreation Regulations along with a list changes for 2013; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of the Regulations is to provide sustainable use of Tribal recreational and natural resources, and promote economic development; and

WHEREAS, the recreational-use seasons, prices, possession limits, prohibitions and regulations are based on sound biological, business, and sustainable use principles; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council therefore concludes that the Tribal Member Outdoor Recreation Regulations for 2013, as amended herein, should be approved by the Tribal Council.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves and adopts the Tribal Member Outdoor Recreation Regulations for 2013, as amended and incorporated by this reference.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that in the event that this Resolution conflicts with a prior Resolution or Policy, this Resolution shall supersede and govern over the conflicting subject matter.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that in the event this Resolution directly conflicts with the Tribal Constitution, Tribal Ordinances or Federal Laws, this Resolution shall be declared null and void and have no legal effect.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Chairman, or in his absence, the Acting Chairman, is hereby authorized to execute any and all documents necessary to effectuate the intent of this Resolution. In the event that the Chairman fails to delegate signatory authority to an Acting Chairman, the Vice-Chairman may sign.

The foregoing resolution was on JUNE 20, 2013 duly adopted by a vote of SEVEN for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to the authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (f), (h), (i), (s), (t) and (u) of the Tribal Constitution, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).

MAJOR CHANGES FOR 2013 Wildlife & Outdoor Recreation Division "GAME & FISH DEPARTMENT" Outdoor Recreation Regulations

Salt River Second Pole Permit: Second pole permit which would be legal ONLY on the Salt River from 260 bridge downstream to the reservation boundary. Cost would be \$9.00 each and only one would be issued per person per day. Must purchase Special Use Permit to get Salt River Second Pole Permit.

General Regulations for Tribal Members

Restrictions

The following activities are unlawful:

1. Use of more than one rod or one line when angling for any fish. Rods or lines must be closely attended.
2. Catching all or part of another person's catch limit.
3. Taking or attempting to take fish from federal hatchery facilities.
4. Removal, alteration or possession of signs.
5. Angling through a human-made ice hole larger 9 inches diameter or length.
6. It is unlawful to transport live fish from one water body to another.
7. Wasting fish.
8. Taking or attempting to take any fish by means of chumming, or knowingly angle with aid of chum.
9. Dispose of dead animal (fish) carcasses, or parts thereof, in reservation waters.
10. Live fish may not be used or held for use as bait.

KEY RECREATION REGULATIONS

All-Terrain Vehicles (ATVs) including 3 & 4 wheelers and dirt bikes are strictly prohibited from the Reservation. Golf Carts (regardless of it being registered) are prohibited.

Vehicles must stay on established roadways at all times.
