



WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE

A Sovereign Tribal Nation

(Authorizing Business License for Hayden S. Anderson)

- WHEREAS,** pursuant to Article IV, Section 1(a) and 1(s) of the Constitution of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, *inter alia*, the Tribal Council has the authority to represent the Tribe and act in all matters that concern the welfare of the Tribe; and
- WHEREAS,** the Tribal Council recognizes the significant unemployment rate and shortage of employment opportunities within the reservation communities; and
- WHEREAS,** the Tribal Council encourages its Tribal members to engage in all forms of entrepreneurial activity, including private ventures and self-employment; and
- WHEREAS,** the Tribal Council supports carefully constructed businesses which seek to promote the accrual of economic benefits to its Tribal members; and
- WHEREAS,** Hayden S. Anderson, enrolled Tribal member of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, is present and requests approval from the Tribal Council to create and establish a Native-owned business to buy and sell firewood, posts and furniture; and
- WHEREAS,** the Tribal Council finds it in the best interest of the White Mountain Apache Tribe to issue a Business License for Hayden S. Anderson.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves a Business License for Tribal member Hayden S. Anderson for the purpose of buying and selling firewood, posts and furniture for his private business.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that as a condition of authorizing the Business License, Hayden S. Anderson agrees to follow any and all applicable rules and regulations as set forth by the Tribe.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that in the event that this Resolution conflicts with a prior Resolution or Policy, this Resolution shall supersede and govern over the conflicting subject matter.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that in the event this Resolution directly conflicts with the Tribal Constitution, Tribal Ordinances or Federal Laws, or any material facts concerning the issues presented are later found to be false, this Resolution shall be deemed null and void and have no legal effect.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Chairman, or in his absence, the Vice-Chairman, is hereby authorized to execute any and all documents necessary to effectuate the intent of this Resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on **SEPTEMBER 15, 2014** duly adopted by a vote of **EIGHT** for, **ZERO** against, and **THREE** abstentions by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it under the enumerated powers listed in Article IV, Section 1 of the WMAT Constitution, so ratified on September 30, 1993, and federally recognized pursuant to Section 16 of the Indian Reorganization Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
