



WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE

A Sovereign Tribal Nation

(Approval of Early Childhood Outreach Division of Summit Healthcare Association to Provide Parent Workshops and Other Services)

WHEREAS, The Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe ("Tribe") is entrusted by the Tribe's Constitution to act in all matters that concern the welfare of the Tribe, to manage all economic affairs and enterprises of the Tribe, and to regulate subordinate organizations for economic and other purposes; and

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe recognizes the benefits of the Early Childhood Outreach Division of Summit Healthcare Association for children ages birth to five years to families residing on the White Mountain Apache Tribal lands; and

WHEREAS, the Early Childhood Outreach Division of Summit Healthcare Association has obtained a grant to provide parent workshops, participate in community events to promote early childhood development, distribute children's books, and to travel throughout the Tribal lands to provide medical van project services for health and child development services to families residing on the White Mountain Apache Tribal lands; and

WHEREAS, the project was started October 1, 2014 and will be ongoing; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council finds it in the best interest of Tribal members to authorize the requests set forth in the grant and made by Early Childhood Outreach Division of Summit Healthcare Association.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby authorizes the Early Childhood Outreach Division of Summit Healthcare Association to conduct the following:

1. Schedule and run parent workshops on Tribal property for members of the White Mountain Apache Tribe.
2. Participate in community events on the White Mountain Apache Tribe to promote early childhood development.
3. Distribute children's books to members of the White Mountain Apache Tribe.
4. Travel throughout the White Mountain Apache Tribal lands with the Summit Healthcare Association mobile van to provide services for health and child development to Tribal and non-Tribal programs including, but not limited to Tribal Women, Infants and Children (WIC); Tribal Head Start; Tribal Day Care; Tribal Child Find; Whiteriver Unified School District and other approved locations.


Resolution No. 10-2014-161

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that in the event that this Resolution conflicts with a prior Resolution or Policy, this Resolution shall supersede and govern over the conflicting subject matter.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that in the event this Resolution directly conflicts with the Tribal Constitution, Tribal Ordinances or Federal Laws, or any material facts concerning the issues presented are later found to be false, this Resolution shall be deemed null and void and have no legal effect.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Chairman, or in his absence, the Vice-Chairman, is hereby authorized to execute any and all documents necessary to effectuate the intent of this Resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on **OCTOBER 8, 2014** duly adopted by a vote of **SIX** for, **ZERO** against, and **ZERO** abstentions by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it under the enumerated powers listed in Article IV, Section 1 of the WMAT Constitution, so ratified on September 30, 1993, and federally recognized pursuant to Section 16 of the Indian Reorganization Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
