



# WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE

A Sovereign Tribal Nation

## (Authorizing the Acceptance of the Former BIA Detention Facility, Identified as BIA Building No. 84)

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**WHEREAS,** pursuant to Tribal Council Resolution No. 05-2010-128, the White Mountain Apache Tribe requested the transfer of the former BIA Detention Facility (BIA Building No. 84), to the Tribe for Tribal Law Enforcement Program purposes; and

**WHEREAS,** the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) has completed the environmental remediation of BIA Building No. 84, and said building is now available for transfer to the Tribe; and

**WHEREAS,** the BIA has agreed to provide the Tribe with copies of all Environmental Assessment Reports, Engineering Reports, and Asbestos Abatement Reports upon said building transfer; and

**WHEREAS,** the Tribal Council finds it in the best interest of the White Mountain Apache Tribe and its Law Enforcement Program, to accept the transfer of BIA Building No. 84 for Tribal use and ownership.

**BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby accepts the transfer of the former BIA Detention Facility, identified as BIA Building No. 84, including any and all appurtenant reports relating to the real property, for Tribal use and ownership.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that upon transfer of said property by Quitclaim Deed, this property shall be included on the property inventory of the Tribe, and shall be assigned to the Tribal Law Enforcement Program for program use.


**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that in the event that this Resolution conflicts with a prior Resolution or Policy, this Resolution shall supersede and govern over the conflicting subject matter.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that in the event this Resolution directly conflicts with the Tribal Constitution, Tribal Ordinances or Federal Laws, or any material facts concerning the issues presented are later found to be false, this Resolution shall be deemed null and void and have no legal effect.


**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Chairman, or in his absence, the Vice-Chairman, is hereby authorized to execute any and all documents necessary to effectuate the intent of this Resolution.

**Resolution No. 05-2015-93**

The foregoing resolution was on **MAY 18, 2015** duly adopted by a vote of **NINE** for, **ZERO** against, and **ZERO** abstentions by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it under the enumerated powers listed in Article IV, Section 1 of the WMAT Constitution, so ratified on September 30, 1993, and federally recognized pursuant to Section 16 of the Indian Reorganization Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
