

WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE

A Sovereign Tribal Nation

(Approving Memorandum of Agreement with U.S. Indian Health Service for Construction of Water and Sewer Services for Scattered Homes, Project PH 16-F26)

- **WHEREAS**, pursuant to Article IV, Section 1(a) of the Constitution of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, *inter alia*, the Tribal Council has the authority to represent the Tribe and act in all matters that concern the welfare of the Tribe; and
- WHEREAS, the U.S. Indian Health Service desires to enter into a Memorandum of Agreement with the White Mountain Apache Tribe to construct water and sewer services for scattered new or like-new homes at a total estimated cost of \$240,000.00 (PH16-F26), the Indian Health Service is contributing all project funding through "Housing" funds; and
- WHEREAS, upon completion of such service by the Indian Health Service, the water and sewer connections will be transferred to the Tribe or individual home owner as appropriate; and
- WHEREAS, such facilities are needed for the Tribal members of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation and benefits derived from such facilities will far offset any damages that may occur from the land utilized; and
- **WHEREAS**, the Tribal Council finds that the Memorandum of Agreement is in the best interests of the Tribe and should be approved.
- **BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Memorandum of Agreement to construct water and sewer services for scattered homes, including the waiver of damages for rights-of-way, as attached and incorporated by this reference, is hereby approved.
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Chairman, or in his absence, the Vice Chairman, is hereby authorized to execute any and all document necessary to effectuate the intent of this Resolution.
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that in the event this Resolution directly conflicts with the Tribal Constitution, Tribal Ordinances, or any material facts concerning the issues presented are later found to be false, this Resolution shall be deemed null and void and have no legal effect.
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Chairman, or in his absence, the Vice-Chairman, is hereby authorized to execute any and all documents necessary to effectuate the intent of this Resolution.
