(Approving Forest Management Deduction Expenditure Plan 2017-2018)

WHEREAS, pursuant to Article IV, Section 1(a) and 1(s) of the Constitution of the White Mountain Apache Tribe; and

WHEREAS, as per 25 U.S.C. § 3105(c), the White Mountain Apache Tribe is eligible to receive money by withholding sales proceeds from timber harvested off the Fort Apache Indian Reservation; and

WHEREAS, money generated from such withholdings related to forest land management activities are placed in to the Forest Management Deduction Fund; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has reviewed the Expenditure Plan for Forest Management Deductions from May 1, 2017 to April 30, 2018, as attached and incorporated by this reference; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council finds that the Plan should be approved and that the use of Forest Management Deduction Funds should coincide with the current Tribal Forestry Budget, for the Tribal Fiscal Year 2017-2018.

WHEREAS, given the urgency of submitting the request to the relevant agencies, the Tribal Council further finds that the Forest Management Deduction Expenditure Plan needs to be considered and made outside of its regularly scheduled meeting; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council further finds that: (1) this Resolution may be voted upon by signature of a member of the Tribal Council where a signature indicates a vote for this Resolution, (2) the Tribal Council Secretary should attempt to obtain signatures for members of the Tribal Council personally, (3) no signature would mean that the respective Tribal Council member is against this Resolution, (4) the Tribal Council Secretary should wait no longer than a reasonable period of time to obtain a vote by signature or by no signature and so indicate that this Resolution was presented to the respective member of the Tribal Council for a vote.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves the Forest Management Deduction Expenditure Plan of \$173,809.12 for the Tribal Fiscal Year 2017-2018 as attached and incorporated by this reference.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Deferred funds from the Forest Management Deductions Account of \$299,449.28 will be used to cover the 10% stumpage repayment balance in arrears of

\$249,260.22. The remaining balance of Forest Management Deduction will be \$50,189.06. This balance will be deferred for future use to cover Forest Management Expenses of Tribal Forestry in FY 2018 through 2019.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that \$249,260.22 will be paid to the lockbox account in Atlanta, Ga maintained by the Office of Special Trustee (OST) FOR FUTURE USE BY White Mountain Apache Tribal Forestry. The payment will be made to the FM7628FR8 Account (White Mountain 10% Forest Management Deduction).

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that given the urgency of the request described herein, this Resolution may be voted upon as follows: (a) by signature of a member of the Tribal Council, including the Chairman of the Tribal Council and the Vice-Chairman of the Tribal Council, where a signature indicates a vote for this Resolution, (b) the Tribal Council Secretary shall attempt to obtain signatures for members of the Tribal Council personally, (c) no signature shall mean that the respective Tribal Council member is against this Resolution, (d) the Tribal Council Secretary should wait no longer than a reasonable period of time to obtain a vote by signature or by no signature, and so indicate that this Resolution was presented to the respective member of the Tribal Council for a vote.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that the Chairman, or in his absence, the Vice Chairman, is hereby authorized to execute any and all documents necessary to effectuate the intent of this Resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>April 27, 2017</u> duly adopted by a vote of <u>SEVEN</u> for, <u>ZERO</u> against, and <u>ZERO</u> abstention by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to the authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (i), (k), (s), (t), and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe, September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat, 984).

A. <u>Narrative</u>: Describe the type and extent of anticipated costs to be incurred by the Tribe to manage, administer and account for activities funded under Part II. These costs shall be a negotiated amount as agreed to between the Bureau and the Tribe, but in no event shall they exceed the amount established through the audit for contracts and grants on the reservation.

The tribe will be paid \$6,000 for FY2017-18 to reimburse them for administrative assistance provided to the tribal forestry program. Funds will be paid to the tribe at a rate of \$500 per month from 001-082-7706 account. For the amount indicated, the tribe will provide accounting, personnel, and other support services needed.

Each month the tribe submits a voucher for expenditures, signed by the tribal treasurer, which is eligible for reimbursement from forest management deduction monies held in an agency IIM account. After the voucher is verified for accuracy it is submitted to the agency superintendent, who then directs the finance office to prepare a wire transfer to the tribal government account.

PART V - Funds Not Transferred - Deferred for Future Use. \$ 299,449.28

Briefly describe future projects and/or activities that the deferred funds are reserved for if known. Justification is not required to defer funds for future use.

Deferred funds will be saved for the Tribe for future FMD drawdowns. Balance remaining of old FATCO stumpage repayment of \$249,260.22 will also be paid from PART V of Expenditure Plan.
