



WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE

A Sovereign Tribal Nation

(Approving Renewal of Inter-Governmental Agreement Between the Tribe and the City of Show Low for Law Enforcement Mutual Aid Services)

WHEREAS, The Constitution of the White Mountain Apache Tribe of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation provides, at Article IV, Section 1(b) that the Tribal Council (“Council”) shall exercise the power “To negotiate, make and perform contracts and agreements of every descriptionwith any...municipality....”; and

WHEREAS, On September 13, 2016, by Resolution No. 09-2016-188, the Council approved a three-year Inter-Governmental Agreement with the City of Show Low for Law Enforcement Mutual Assistance (“IGA”); and

WHEREAS, The IGA will expire on September 21st of this year; and

WHEREAS, The White Mountain Apache Police Department, at this time, proposes that the Tribe renew the IGA; and

WHEREAS, The Tribe’s Office of the Attorney General and the Show Low’s City Attorney have made several minor amendments, meant to clarify the IGA’s equal application between the Tribe and the City, the division of items seized by police activities, and mutual indemnification of the Parties (attached and incorporated herein by reference); and

WHEREAS, The Council have reviewed the proposed IGA renewal, as amended, and find that its approval will help the Tribe promote public safety within the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and is in the best interests of the Tribe and its members.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Inter-Governmental Agreement between the Tribe and the City of Show Low for law enforcement mutual aid is hereby approved, as amended and attached.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that in the event this Resolution directly conflicts with the Tribal Constitution, Tribal Ordinances, or any material facts concerning the issues presented are later found to be false, this Resolution shall be deemed null and void and have no legal effect.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that in the event that this Resolution conflicts with a prior Resolution or Policy, this Resolution shall supersede and govern over the conflicting subject matter.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Chairwoman, or in her absence, the Vice-Chairman, is hereby authorized to execute any and all documents necessary to effectuate the intent of this Resolution.


