



WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE

A Sovereign Tribal Nation

(Approving Head Start 2019-2020 Budget, Self Assessment, Training & Professional Development Plans 2019-2020, MA HS Self Assessment, and 2018-2019 Annual Report)

WHEREAS, The Constitution of the White Mountain Apache Tribe of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation provides, at Article IV, Section 1(s) that the Tribal Council (“Council”) shall exercise the power “To regulate subordinate organizations...”; and

WHEREAS, The White Mountain Apache Head Start Program (“Head Start”) and the White Mountain Apache Tribe (“Grantee-Tribe”), both provide valuable early childhood development services to the children of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation (“Reservation”); and

WHEREAS, The 2019-2020 Head Start annual budgetary cycle runs from December 1, 2019 to November 30, 2020; and

WHEREAS, The 2019-2020 Head Start budget is \$2,231,048.00 which amount provides funding for 252 students and 49 staff members located at three different centers across the Reservation; and

WHEREAS, The Grantee-Tribe has legal and fiscal responsibility for administering and overseeing Head Start Program, including the safeguarding of Federal funds. Grantee-Tribe must review and approve all applications for funding, documents, and amendments; and

WHEREAS, Required in the 2019-2020 Head Start Budget are the 2019 Self-Assessment, Head Start Training and Professional Development Plans for 2019-2020, 2019 White Mountain Apache Head Start Community Assessment, and Annual Report for 2018-2019; and

WHEREAS, This 2019-2020 budgetary cycle is the fifth year for the non-competitive year five-years granted the Tribe under 45 C.F.R. Section 1307.7 and the Tribe must show satisfactory performance under the terms and conditions of the Head Start Grant in the current budget period.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves the 2019-2020 White Mountain Apache Head Start Budget, with the attendant 2019 Self-Assessment, Head Start Training and Professional Development Plans for 2019-2020, 2019 White Mountain Apache Head Start Community Assessment, and Annual Report for 2018-2019.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs White Mountain Apache Head Start to make a timely and complete submission of the required reports and materials to Head Start’s federal overseers.



Resolution No. 09-2019-188

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that in the event this Resolution directly conflicts with the Tribal Constitution, Tribal Ordinances, or any material facts concerning the issues presented are later found to be false, this Resolution shall be deemed null and void and have no legal effect.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that in the event that this Resolution conflicts with a prior Resolution or Policy, this Resolution shall supersede and govern over the conflicting subject matter.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Chairwoman, or in her absence, the Vice-Chairman, is hereby authorized to execute any and all documents necessary to effectuate the intent of this Resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on September 12, 2019 duly adopted by a vote of EIGHT for, ZERO against, and ONE abstentions by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it under the enumerated powers listed in Article IV, Section 1 of the WMAT Constitution, so ratified on September 30, 1993, and federally recognized pursuant to Section 16 of the Indian Reorganization Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
