



WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE
A Sovereign Tribal Nation

(Approving Memorandum of Agreement Between the Tribe's Division of Health Programs and Whiteriver Unified School District No. 20 for Community Health Representative Services)

WHEREAS, The Constitution of the White Mountain Apache Tribe of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation provides, at Article IV, Section 1(b) that the Tribal Council ("Council") shall exercise the power "To negotiate, make and perform contracts and agreements of every description..."; and

WHEREAS, The Whiteriver Unified School District #20 (the "School District") has need of assistance in providing for its students' routine vision, auditory, blood pressure, weight, and height screenings, and education on health and disease prevention, as well as health promotions and home visits; and

WHEREAS, The Tribe's Community Health Representative Program is able to provide those services listed above for the School District; and

WHEREAS, The Division of Health Programs, this day, presents for Council's approval a proposed Memorandum of Agreement between the Division of Health and the School District whereby the Community Health Representative Program would provide the needed services to the School District from September 2019 to August 2021 (attached and incorporated herein by reference); and

WHEREAS, The proposed Memorandum of Agreement does not waive the Tribe's sovereign immunity from suit nor obligate any Tribal funds; and

WHEREAS, The Council has reviewed the proposed Memorandum of Agreement and finds that its approval will help provide necessary healthcare services to the students of Whiteriver Unified School District, and is in the best interests of the Tribe and its members.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the attached Memorandum of Agreement between the White Mountain Apache Division of Health Programs and Whiteriver Unified School District No. 20 for the provision of community health representative services is hereby approved.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that in the event this Resolution directly conflicts with the Tribal Constitution, Tribal




Ordinances, or any material facts concerning the issues presented are later found to be false, this Resolution shall be deemed null and void and have no legal effect.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that in the event that this Resolution conflicts with a prior Resolution or Policy, this Resolution shall supersede and govern over the conflicting subject matter.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Chairwoman, or in her absence, the Vice-Chairman, is hereby authorized to execute any and all documents necessary to effectuate the intent of this Resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on **OCTOBER 2, 2019** duly adopted by a vote of **SIX** for, **ZERO** against, and **FIVE** abstentions by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it under the enumerated powers listed in Article IV, Section 1 of the WMAT Constitution, so ratified on September 30, 1993, and federally recognized pursuant to Section 16 of the Indian Reorganization Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
