



WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE

A Sovereign Tribal Nation

(Authorizing Publication of Certain Manuscripts by Johns Hopkins Personnel)

- WHEREAS,** The Constitution of the White Mountain Tribe (“Tribe”) of the Fort Apache Reservation (“Constitution”) provides, at Article IV, Section 1(a) that the Tribal Council (“Council”) shall exercise the power “To represent the Tribe and act in all matters that concern the welfare of the Tribe”; and
- WHEREAS,** The White Mountain Apache Tribe in conjunction with Johns Hopkins University has conducted research projects for nearly 40 years which aim to raise the level of health of all residents of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation; and
- WHEREAS,** The Tribal Council supports the continued progress and positive outcomes from the research projects that have attributed to medical and mental/behavioral science and the development of preventions and interventions which seek to decrease or alleviate certain health problems; and
- WHEREAS,** Johns Hopkins is requesting permission to publish two manuscripts entitled:
- 1) *Protecting Our Future Generation: Study Protocol for a Randomized Controlled Trial Evaluating a Sexual Health Self-Care Intervention with Native American Youth and Young Adults*; and
 - 2) *Behavioral and Mental Health outcomes from an RCT of a Youth Entrepreneurship Intervention among Native American Adolescents*; and
- WHEREAS,** No personal identifiers are indicated or referenced in the manuscripts, and all information contained in the manuscripts is submitted for the purpose of developing strategies designed to intervene and diminish the problems associated with *Sexual risk, Substance use, Suicide, and Violence* occurring among members of the White Mountain Apache Tribe; and
- WHEREAS,** The manuscripts, if approved, will be submitted for publication in the medical journals **BMC Public Health** and **Journal of Adolescent Health**; and
- WHEREAS,** The Tribal Council finds that encouraging these studies and publication of the manuscripts may contribute to reduction of sexual risk, substance use, suicide, and violence among members of the Tribe, and is in the best interests of the Tribe and its members.

Resolution No. 10-2019-211

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves the manuscripts described herein for publication in the medical journals listed above.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby requests a copy of the publication should it be accepted for publication.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that in the event this Resolution directly conflicts with the Tribal Constitution, Tribal Ordinances, or any material facts concerning the issues presented are later found to be false, this Resolution shall be deemed null and void and have no legal effect.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that in the event that this Resolution conflicts with a prior Resolution or Policy, this Resolution shall supersede and govern over the conflicting subject matter.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Chairwoman, or in her absence, the Vice-Chairman, is hereby authorized to execute any and all documents necessary to effectuate the intent of this Resolution.


