



# WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE

A Sovereign Tribal Nation

## (Approving New Hon Dah Community Access Road Names)

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**WHEREAS,** The Constitution of the White Mountain Apache Tribe (“Tribe”) of the Fort Apache Reservation (“Constitution) provides, at Article IV, Section 1(a) that the Tribal Council (“Council”) shall exercise the power “To represent the Tribe and act in all matters that concern the welfare of the Tribe”; and

**WHEREAS,** To facilitate accurate and quick response times, the WMAT Division of Transportation (“WMAT-DOT”) and the WMAT Fire Department (“WMAT-FD”) request that all roads are named and placed in the 911 Emergency Addressing System; and

**WHEREAS,** The White Mountain Apache Housing Authority (“WMAHA”) plans to develop new homes in the community of Hon Dah, for which new access roads will be needed; and

**WHEREAS,** The WMAHA, WMAT-PD and WMAT-DOT have agreed on the road names “Pronghorn Drive”, “Apache Pine Boulevard”, “Red Stag Drive”, and “Fox Loop;” and

**WHEREAS,** These access roads will be entered into the 911 Emergency Addressing System immediately and in the WMAT-DOT road inventory one year after roads are put into service and WMAHA’s one-year warranty lapses.

**BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves the road names, as follows: “Pronghorn Drive”, “Apache Pine Boulevard”, “Red Stag Drive” and “Fox Loop” for the new roads that will service the new WMAHA development.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it directs that these newly approved road names be included into the 911 Emergency Addressing System immediately and in the WMAT-DOT road inventory one year after the roads are put into service and WMAHA’s one-year warranty lapses.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that in the event this Resolution directly conflicts with the Tribal Constitution, Tribal Ordinances, or any material facts concerning the issues presented are later found to be false, this Resolution shall be deemed null and void and have no legal effect.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that in the event that this Resolution conflicts with a prior Resolution or Policy, this Resolution shall supersede and govern over the conflicting subject matter.

**Resolution No. 10-2019-222**

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Chairman, or in his absence, the Vice-Chairman, is hereby authorized to execute any and all documents necessary to effectuate the intent of this Resolution.


The foregoing resolution was on **OCTOBER 28, 2019** duly adopted by a vote of **NINE** for, **ZERO** against, and **TWO** abstentions by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it under the enumerated powers listed in Article IV, Section 1 of the WMAT Constitution, so ratified on September 30, 1993, and federally recognized pursuant to Section 16 of the Indian Reorganization Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
