



# WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE

A Sovereign Tribal Nation

**(Authorizing Tribal Emergency Operations Center to Purchase  
Items from Basha for Community Care Packages with an Allocation of  
\$190,538.91 of CARES Act Funding)**

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**WHEREAS,** The Constitution of the White Mountain Apache Tribe (“Tribe”) of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation (“Constitution”) provides, at Article IV, Section 1(a) that the Tribal Council (“Council”) shall exercise the power “[t]o represent the tribe and act in all matters that concern the welfare of the Tribe, and to make decision not inconsistent with or contrary to this constitution”; and

**WHEREAS,** The Council would like to provide care packages of groceries and cleaning supplies to every home on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation (“Reservation”) to assist the community during these unprecedented times; and

**WHEREAS,** The Emergency Operations Center (“EOC”) has identified 4,012 homes on the Reservation based on recent data gathered from the Tribe’s Housing Authority and has created a plan to deliver these care packages; and

**WHEREAS,** The EOC has obtained an estimate from Basha’s totaling \$190,538.91 requests an allocation of Cares Act funding to cover this expense; and

**WHEREAS,** The Council has reviewed the EOC’s request and finds that authorizing them to make the above purchase with an allocation of CARES Act funds will provide the Reservation’s residents with badly needed supplies and is in the best interests of the Tribe and its members.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves an allocation of \$190,538.91 to cover costs associated with the community care packages, to be purchased by the Tribe’s Emergency Operations Center.

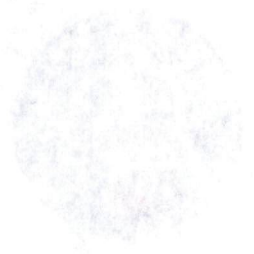
**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that in the event this Resolution directly conflicts with the Tribal Constitution, Tribal Ordinances, or any material facts concerning the issues presented are later found to be false, this Resolution shall be deemed null and void and have no legal effect.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that in the event that this Resolution conflicts with a prior Resolution or Policy, this Resolution shall supersede and govern over the conflicting subject matter.


