



# WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE

## A Sovereign Tribal Nation

### (Amending Resolution No. 02-2022-32, Authorizing the White Mountain Apache Tribal Court to Apply for the U.S. Department of Justice Coordinated Tribal Assistance Solicitation Grant 2022 Purpose Area # 3)

---

**WHEREAS,** The Constitution of the White Mountain Apache Tribe (“Tribe”) of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation (“Constitution”) provides, at Article IV, Section 1(j) that the Tribal Council (“Council”) shall exercise the power “[t]o accept grants and donations from any person, State or the United States”; and

**WHEREAS,** By Council Resolution No. 02-2022-32, the Council authorized the Tribal Court to apply for Coordinated Tribal Assistance Solicitation Grant (“CTAS Grant”) Purpose Area #3, for the amount of \$1.3 million, and the stated purpose of purchasing a portable building for the Court’s usage; and

**WHEREAS,** After receiving advice from the Tribe’s grants consultant, it was determined that, this year, the Tribe should seek \$900,000.00 for Tribal Court resources including needed equipment, security and safety systems, possible staff acquisition and planning resources to pursue future centralized and consolidated public safety and judicial facilities; and

**WHEREAS,** The Council finds that amending Resolution No. 02-2022-32 to be consistent with the above-stated amount and purpose for CTAS Purpose Area #3, will help the Tribe further prepare for a future comprehensive justice center while providing needed materials now, and is in the best interests of the Tribe and its members.

**BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby amends Resolution No. 02-2022-32, to authorize the Tribal Court to apply for 2022 Coordinated Tribal Assistance Solicitation Grant Purpose Area #2, in the amount of \$900,000.00 for Tribal Court resources including needed equipment, security and safety systems, possible staff acquisition and planning resources to pursue future centralized and consolidated public safety and judicial facilities.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that should the CTAS Grant be awarded, the Tribal Court and the Tribal Treasurer are instructed to establish an account for receipts and expenditures thereunder.


**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that in the event this Resolution directly conflicts with the Tribal Constitution, Tribal Ordinances, or any material facts concerning the issues presented are later found to be false, this Resolution shall be deemed null and void and have no legal effect.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that in the event that this Resolution conflicts with a prior Resolution or Policy, this Resolution shall supersede and govern over the conflicting subject matter.


***Resolution No. 3-2022-58***

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Chairwoman, or in her absence, the Vice-Chairman, is hereby authorized to execute any and all documents necessary to effectuate the intent of this Resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on MARCH 10, 2022 duly adopted by a vote of TEN for, ZERO against, and ZERO abstentions by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it under the enumerated powers listed in Article IV, Section 1 of the WMAT Constitution, so ratified on September 30, 1993, and federally recognized pursuant to Section 16 of the Indian Reorganization Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
