



WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE

A Sovereign Tribal Nation

(Authorizing the Department of Planning to apply for Employment and Training Grants, through the Department of Labor’s Indian and Native American Program)

WHEREAS, The Constitution of the White Mountain Apache Tribe (“Tribe”) of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation provides, at Article IV, Section 1(j) that the Tribal Council (“Council”) shall exercise the power, “To accept grants and donations from any person, State or the United States”; and

WHEREAS, The Tribe has tasked the Planning Department (“Planning”) with seeking grant opportunities; and

WHEREAS, The Department of Labor’s Indian and Native American Program is offering Employment and Training Grants (“the Grant”), which, if awarded would provide individual training, education and other supportive services up to \$5,000 per person, for Tribal members who qualify for the program; and

WHEREAS, If awarded, the period of performance would start July 2022 and continue for a 36-week duration, with three subsequent years also offered; and

WHEREAS, The Grant does not contain a Tribal match requirement; and

WHEREAS, The Council finds that the Grant will, if awarded, help the Tribe with providing new job opportunities and workforce development programs, and is in the best interests of the Tribe and its members.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby authorizes and instructs the Planning Department to make a complete and timely submission to the Indian and Native American Program – Employment and Training Grants, offered by the Department of Labor, Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that should the Grant be awarded, the Tribal Treasurer and the Planning Department shall work together to establish and account and budget for receipts and expenditures for the Grant.



BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that in the event this Resolution directly conflicts with the Tribal Constitution, Tribal Ordinances, or any material facts concerning the issues presented are later found to be false, this Resolution shall be deemed null and void and have no legal effect.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that in the event that this Resolution conflicts with a prior Resolution or Policy, this Resolution shall supersede and govern over the conflicting subject matter.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Chairman, or in his absence, the Vice-Chairman, is hereby authorized to execute any and all documents necessary to effectuate the intent of this Resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on MAY 5, 2022 duly adopted by a vote of ELEVEN for, ZERO against, and ZERO abstentions by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it under the enumerated powers listed in Article IV, Section 1 of the WMAT Constitution, so ratified on September 30, 1993, and federally recognized pursuant to Section 16 of the Indian Reorganization Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
