A Sovereign Tribal Nation

**(Approving Land Restoration Board Selection of the Land Restoration
Projects for Fiscal Year 2023-2024)**

WHEREAS, The Constitution of the White Mountain Apache Tribe (“Tribe”) of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation (“Constitution”) provides at Article IV, Section 1(s), that the Tribal Council shall exercise the power “to regulate subordinate organizations for economic and other purposes”, and in section 1(f), “To protect and preserve the wildlife, plant life, forests, natural resources and water rights of the Tribe...”; and

WHEREAS, On November 9, 1995, by Resolution No. 11-95-354, the Tribal Council set aside twenty percent of the 22-H judgment funds for the establishment of a perpetual and permanent White Mountain Apache Land Restoration Fund; and

WHEREAS, The Land Restoration Code authorizes ten (10) percent of the funds to be available for implementing activities with the remaining balance divided at eighty (80) percent for land restoration projects and twenty (20) percent for scholarships and internships; and

WHEREAS, The Land Restoration Board, at this time requests that the Tribal Council provide final approval for the following five projects, proposed by the named persons:

1. Brenda Begay – Green Waste Project
2. Jarvis Davis – Smith Cienega Fuels Reduction Project
3. Sean Parker – Summer Common Ground Outdoor Activities
4. Shalitha Peaches – Fostering Young Apache Gatherers
5. Thomas Pacheco – Whiteriver Community Garden & Outreach

WHEREAS, The Council concurs with the Land Restoration Board and finds it in the best interest of the Tribe to approve the above-listed projects.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby authorizes approval of the five (5) Land Restoration Fund projects listed above.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that in the event this Resolution directly conflicts with the Tribal Constitution, Tribal Ordinances, or any material facts concerning the issues presented are later found to be false, this Resolution shall be deemed null and void and have no legal effect.

Resolution No. 07-2023-168

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that in the event that this Resolution conflicts with a prior Resolution or Policy, this Resolution shall supersede and govern over the conflicting subject matter.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Chairman, or in his absence, the Vice-Chairman, is hereby authorized to execute any and all documents necessary to effectuate the intent of this Resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on JULY 5, 2023 duly adopted by a vote of FIVE for, FOUR against, and ONE abstentions by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it under the enumerated powers listed in Article IV, Section 1 of the WMAT Constitution, so ratified on November 10, 2021, and federally recognized pursuant to Section 16 of the Indian Reorganization Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
