



# WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE

## A Sovereign Tribal Nation

### (Authorizing Application by Ndee Bikiyaa for ANA Language Preservation & Maintenance Grant Program)

---

**WHEREAS,** The Constitution of the White Mountain Apache Tribe of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation (“Reservation”) provides, at Article IV, Section 1(a) that the Tribal Council (“Council”) shall exercise the power “[t]o represent the Tribe and act in all matters that concern the welfare of the Tribe”, and in Section 1(j) “[t]o accept grants and donations from any person, state, or the United States”; and

**WHEREAS,** The Council has declared development of Ndee Bikiyaa, Tribal Farm, and partners for language preservation efforts as a high priority and have determined it to be beneficial and productive; and

**WHEREAS,** Funding assistance is needed by Ndee Bikiyaa for salaries, benefits, equipment, supplies, and other needs to incorporate language preservation into farm programs; and

**WHEREAS,** Administration for Native Americans (“ANA”) Language Preservation & Maintenance has announced availability up to \$900,000 in grants that support projects, with a cost share requirement that can be fulfilled with other farm grant funding, for which the Tribal Farm is eligible (“Grant”); and

**WHEREAS,** The Tribal Council has reviewed Ndee Bikiyaa’s request, and finds that authorizing the Tribal Farm to apply for the ANA grant is in the best interests of the Tribe and its members.

**BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby authorizes and instructs Ndee Bikiyaa to make a timely and complete submission of the ANA Language Preservation & Maintenance Grant Program application for Fiscal Year 2024.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that in the event that the Tribe receives grant funds, Ndee Bikiyaa and the Grants & Contracts Department are instructed to create a budget for receipt and expenditure of said funds, subject to the terms and conditions of any application funding agreement and review by the Tribe’s Office of Attorney General.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that in the event this Resolution directly conflicts with the Tribal Constitution, Tribal Ordinances, or any material facts concerning the issues presented are later found to be false, this Resolution shall be deemed null and void and have no legal effect.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that in the event that this Resolution conflicts with a prior Resolution or Policy, this Resolution shall supersede and govern over the conflicting subject matter.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Chairman, or in his absence, the Vice-Chairman, is hereby authorized to execute any and all documents necessary to effectuate the intent of this Resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on MARCH 06, 2024 duly adopted by a vote of SEVEN for, ZERO against, and FOUR abstentions by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it under the enumerated powers listed in Article IV, Section 1, of the WMAT Constitution, so ratified on November 10, 2021, and federally recognized pursuant to Section 16 of the Indian Reorganization Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
